School Tours: Tours are being organised at the moment and most will be in June. Hopefully the weather will be kind as it has been for the past few years. It makes such a difference!

Junior Entrepreneur Project: Fifth class children will participate in the Junior Entrepreneur Project County Showcase Day in Adare on Wednesday, 27 April. The children will share their entrepreneurial projects, Fun'n'Fit and Sewprise, with other project participants the region and network with fellow junior entrepreneurs. Music Generation: Music Generation is a Music Network initiative. The programme directly links with the National Music Curriculum areas and requirements. The visiting musicians are working on skills building with an added composition element, working towards creating original pieces of work with each group. Third and Fourth Classes are the lucky participants in this structured programme. We will be looking forward to the inaugural 'Schools Summit' event in UL Arena on Monday, 16th May with young people from other schools performing to each other.

Community Music Placement: Renee Hayes and Mary Kelly, both students from UL, have been working with us under the Community Music Work Placement. Senior Infant classes and First classes have benefited from weekly Music Workshops. They were working towards an audio recorded group composition which was a very worthwhile and enjoyable learning experience for all pupils involved.

Confirmation: The Confirmation ceremony was held on Wednesday April 13th in Milford church and it was just beautiful. Ms Deirdre Taylor and Mr Brian Kelly deserve great credit for the excellent preparation of the children for this important occasion in their lives. Special thanks to our school band and their leaders for the beautiful music.

The UL Sport Children's Run for Fun at the Barringtons Hospital Great Limerick Run 2016 will take place on Saturday the 30th of April. We have been encouraging as many children as possible to take part in the run. All of the children's races are off road, starting at the GAA pitch beside the running track and finishing on the running track.

Geoff Hunt: Geoff Hunt, our environmental expert, was back in Milford NS this month and the Fifth Class children have been enjoying pond dipping around the environs of UL and under the microscope in the classrooms.

Shakin' with Shakespeare: This month the literary world marks the 400th anniversary of the death of playwright William Shakespeare, who died on April 23rd 1616. The 6th class pupils of Ms. Murray's "*Shakin' with Shakespeare*" *club* marked this important anniversary with a cake on April 25th 2016, to celebrate the life of William Shakespeare and the wonderful plays he wrote during his lifetime. It is amazing that Shakespeare's plays continue to be widely studied and performed four centuries after his death. *Shakin' with Shakespeare* will re-commence for 5th and 6th class pupils in September 2016.

Discover Primary Science and Maths Award: Milford has applied for the Discover Primary Science and Maths Award 2016. We hope to qualify for a Plaque of STEM. This means that Milford National School will have met all the necessary criteria that falls under five different categories including science, technology, engineering and maths. Milford's Science Club is up and running once again. The aim of this club is to encourage the children's interest in science. Children from 3rd Class attend this club every Thursday where they get the opportunity to carry out fun and exciting experiments. This club has played an important role in ensuring that all the necessary requirements to achieve the Award of Science and Maths Excellence are being met. We submitted our logs of evidence for the award is 25th April. Fingers crossed that our application is successful. Many thanks to Ms Quinlan, Ms Hogan and Ms Munnelly for co-ordinating this valuable programme.

Parking: Yet again, in spite of numerous reminders regarding the car-park regulations, **concern for the safety of children exiting** the school has been expressed to school management.
